And after you did it your way, the worst came – it all fell _____. You were exposed, vulnerable, made a fool of – you were _____, angry, hurt, _____. You turn to your _____ but you do not feel better – there is no one and nobody to turn to, but _____. And how can you turn to _____ when your ignoring _____ got you in this mess in the first place? Will _____ hear? Will _____ ignore you as you have ignored _____? Will you be left utterly alone? But _____ has established a covenant of love with us. We thank God for the covenant.

There are some things that we must do that indicate whether or not we are really ready to go to God. Will we do our part to uphold the covenant after we have broken it? First, we must tell the _____ and nothing but the whole _____. No _____ and no finger pointing and no blaming anyone else. God this is what I did. You must honestly and openly disclose your _____ to God. Second, you must accept _____ for the consequences. Has anybody been hurt? You must accept responsibility to make amends to all of the people. love and grace of Almighty God. When you experience God's mercy, then you can join the
Psalmist in Psalm 103:3-5: Praise the Lord, O my soul – quote verse 1-2 . . . and forget not all his
benefits.

The blessings of covenant life – the blessings of a real relationship with God:

- 1) God forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases – God removes all the sin and the guilt that causes disease. God heals you of forms of sickness as well as setbacks. God understands our fragility.
- 2) Who redeems your life from the pit and crowns you with love and compassion – instead of letting you be taken over by adversity (the pit), God exalts you to royalty – crowns you with love and compassion. God understands how fragile we are.
- 3) Who satisfies your desires with good things so that your strength is renewed like the Eagles – the Lord restores all covenantal benefits, even though sin breached the covenant. The desires that got you into trouble, the Lord satisfies with good things and you will experience yourself as free and vigorous.

The LORD is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love. He will not always accuse, nor will he harbor his anger forever; he does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us . . . for he knows how we are formed, he remembers that we are dust. As for man his days are like grass, he flourishes like a flower of the field; the wind blows over it and it is gone, and its place remembers it no more. But from everlasting to everlasting the LORD's love is with those who fear him and his righteousness with their children's children - with those who keep his covenant and remember to obey his precepts.
